FILM ABOUT INNER CITY SET TO SCREEN IN THE FALLS

Two Filmmakers connected by a 2001 murder in Buffalo's inner city one a friend of the murderer, the other a friend of the victim bring the results of their collaboration to explore race, crime and politics in Buffalo to Niagara Falls next week. "The Forgotten City," documentary featuring interviews of Buffalo's leaders and citizen in its most forgotten neighborhoods, will be screened at 8pm October 7, 2006 at the Niagara Arts & Cultural Center, 1201 Pine Ave., Niagara Falls. The Film's makers, Addison Henderson and Corey Green, will be available for a "meet and greet" at 7:30pm.

Henderson and Green formed The Forgotten City following their meeting, and spent time interviewing the people in places that most news cameras only pass by. Green grew up on Buffalo's East Side, and Henderson, a formally trained actor, has taken

part in other film projects, including narration of "Josiah's Crossing," a video installed at the Underground railroad Interpretive Center at Niagara University's Castellani Art Museum.
